



The contributions presented at the International Conference “Law via the Internet: Free Access, Quality of Information, Effectiveness of Rights” organised by the Institute of Legal Information Theory and Techniques of the Italian National Research Council - ITTIG/ CNR (Florence, October 30-31 2008) provide a wide spectrum of reflections on free access to law drawn from different points of view and countries. This volume focuses on digital legal information, analysing its aspects in the light of the free digital legal culture paradigm and of the actual technological development that is shaping law.
